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Chairman's Chat - February 2024

Pat and I were very sad to hear of the death recently of former double Indycar Champion and Indy500 winner Gil de Ferran who we had the pleasure of spending an evening with during one of his title-winning seasons.

At the time the popular French-born Brazilian was driving for the Penske Indy team which built its race cars on an industrial estate at Upton before shipping them to America to race.



As part of the build process the drivers would have to visit the Poole factory for a seat-fitting and it was on one of these preseason occasions that we were invited to meet Gil and the rest of the team - at the time I was the motoring and motorsport editor for the Bournemouth Echo.

The visit included an informal evening chatting with Gil who, despite being a champion and me only working for a small local British newspaper, was very approachable and friendly giving us plenty of time to ask our questions even though he had probably heard them all before.

He personalised and signed a photograph for us and came across as a very humble and self-effacing person who will be missed by everyone in the sport.

Gil won the British Formula Three championship in 1992 (which I covered at the time for the Echo) before going on to win the 2000 and 2001 Champ Car World Series driving for Penske and the Indy500 in 2003.

Between 2018 and 2021 he worked as sporting director for the McLaren F1 team. He returned to the team last May in a consultant advisory role. The Brazilian Automobile Confederation (CBA) said he suffered a heart attack at a private motor racing club in Opa-locka, Florida.

I have particularly fond memories of the Penske team as they hosted Pat and I at the Indycar race meeting at Laguna Seca in California and a feature article on the team was responsible for me winning the Regional Motoring Journalist of the Year for London and the South.

Final chance to book for Winter Road Run

Entries close on Monday 05 February for the 1020 Winter Road Run and pub lunch which will take place six days later on Sunday 11 February 2024.

As usual the starting point will be Hamworthy Sports Club (10am for a 10.30am departure) from where participants will set out on a 90-minute road route heading north and east into scenic parts of the New Forest and Hampshire before finishing with lunch at the historic thatched Elm Tree pub at Hightown.



Entry fee for the run is £5 only per car to include route book and rally plaque.

Stefan Morawiec who has kindly organised the run has arranged a main course set-price deal of £16.50p per person at the Elm Tree (which must be paid at the time of booking). The menu options are roast beef, roast turkey or roast pork with a vegetarian option. A choice of desserts will be available for £5.95 - payable on the day.

Coach Trip to County Classics museum

Following an enthusiastic response from club members, a coach trip to visit the County Classics Motor Museum at Taunton has been arranged for Thursday 14 March.

As an added bonus, there will be a stop on the way back to visit Perry's Cider Farm at Dowlish Wake near Illminster.

The coach will leave from Hamworthy Sports Club promptly at 9am (parking is available at HSC). We should arrive at Taunton for 11am where there will be a three-hour stop providing plenty of time to visit the museum, have lunch and see some of the other attractions of Taunton town centre.

Because of the restricted size of the museum, participants will be encouraged to split into two groups with the first section heading directly for the museum and the second group having morning coffee or a wander in town before going to the museum.

The coach will then leave Taunton at 2pm for the short journey to the cider farm for a 45-60 minute visit. It is anticipated the coach will arrive back at HSC around 5pm.



Tickets for the day (which includes coach travel, admission to the museum and the cider farm visit) cost £25 per person friends are more than welcome. The coach (which is being provided by Heathside Travel) has 41 seats which will be allocated on a first come first served basis.

There are cafes serving light refreshments located at both the museum and cider farm as well as the option to have lunch at any of the pubs or restaurants in Taunton.

Taunton's County Classics Motor Museum in the heart of the Somerset town has been created by local businessman Patrick Hawkins, who bought and sold his first car, aged 11, and has used his own vehicles and savings to establish the collection.



Around 120 cars and 80 motorcycles predominantly from the 1950s to 1990s are on display along with a mass of motoring memorabilia. Star exhibits include a Ford Escort rally car once owned by Marcus Gronholm; a Porsche 924 racing car driven by the likes of Andy Rouse and Win Percy; a Ford Mustang Mach1 Cobra Jet and a 1964 Villiers off-road motorbike.

Perrys Cider Farm was started in 1920 by William Churchill as a sideline to his blacksmith's (now the company's office) and it has grown to become one of the UK's most highly respected and awarded cider companies. The site includes a 16th Century cider barn, cider cellar, orchards, farm shop and café.

No getting away from MGs in South Africa

While most club members were sheltering from the continual rain in the run-up to Christmas, fellow members Philip and Gina Neate were in warmer climes sunning themselves and slapping on the sun-tan lotion in South Africa.

But as Philip reports, even on holiday almost half-way round the globe, they still couldn't get away from MGs.

While staying in Cape Town they made the acquaintance of members of 'The Crank Handle Club' (many of its members have second homes in the UK) who are very active in South Africa, meet on Wednesday evenings and during the day on Saturdays and have their own club house.

The club members own two veteran cars which are kept in the clubhouse right next to the bar and are used quite extensively. Philip and Gina got to see all this when they were invited to the club's Christmas dinner at a local golf club.

Then the following day they found themselves invited to an MG only picnic (pictured right) where there were over thirty MGs parked on various lawns in the extensive garden of club member Gordon Chunnett.



Their week in and around Cape Town also included a trip up table mountain and a drive east along the well-known garden route to visit friends with amazing car collections as well as several car, motor bike and steam railway museums.

"We had some amazing drives through canyons and mountain ranges, one on our way to Prince Albert town which was unpaved for 17 miles and was very rough in places bringing our speed down to five mph," recalled Philip.

Patrick Havill

Club member Patrick Havill, 80, who lived at Witchampton, died peacefully on 31 December 2023 in Poole hospital after a prolonged period in hospital after fracturing his hip in May.

Patrick had a long association with the MG marque having competed in a 1951 MGTD in the early Sixties (winning his first motorsport speed event in 1962) before moving on to race Caterham 7s and run his own motorsport preparation and driver training business.

In 2019 Patrick tracked down his original event-winning TD (registration GAP 811) and was able to purchase it from its then owner - see picture right.

It was following his re-acquisition of this car that he joined 1020 and brought it along to a few events as well as being a regular at Classic Cars on Christchurch Quay.

"I knew Patrick in his Caterham racing days when I was reporting on motorsport for the Bournemouth Echo," comments Area Secretary Chris Adamson.

"I also bumped into him a couple of times at Beaulieu where he was, for a short time, a volunteer guide in the museum and drove some of the museum's cars giving visitor rides. He was very knowledgeable and keen on all things motoring."



Patrick's funeral will take place at 10.30am on Friday 16 February at the Harbour View Crematorium, Randalls Hill, Lytchett Minster, Poole BH16 6AN. There will be refreshments at the venue afterwards.

Anyone who is anticipating attending is asked to contact me as the funeral directors would like an idea of potential numbers. We send our deepest sympathies to his family.

MGB Register Spring Run

Broadway Tower and Park is a family-owned Cotswold destination set within a 200-acre estate of parkland including a deer park.

Fifteen feet below ground lies a relic of the Cold War - a former monitoring bunker was once part of a wider network of similar structures all over the United Kingdom, built to study and report the effects of nuclear explosions and the resulting radioactive fallout.

New date and new venue for SWVA sale

South Western Vehicle Auctions has moved to a larger and more modern facility at Blackhill Road on the Holton Heath Trading Park and it will be here that their first quarterly Classic Car and Motorcycle Auction of 2024 will take place on Thursday 01 February.

Regulars should note the change of venue (which is just off the Poole to Wareham route on the main entrance road to the estate not far from Phoenix Classics) and, also the change of date from a Friday to a Thursday.

There are fewer cars going under the hammer in the sale than normal - when entries closed there were just 51 lots - three of them MGBs.

Leading the way for the Abingdon output is a rather tired looking 1967 MGB Roadster (Lot 37) which has an indicated 73,721 miles on the clock and a catalogue estimate of between £6,000-£7,000.

Finished in Tartan Red it has a hard-top roof painted in white (the soft-top roof is in need of replacement) and is fitted with a black leather interior and wide wire wheels.

It has been in the same family for over 40 years and comes with a substantial history file which includes records of consistent maintenance, upgrades, old MOT certificates and valuable old photographs that showcase its evolution over time.





It is joined in the sale by a very shabby and well used 1974 chrome bumpered MGB GT (Lot 33) with an unwarranted 44,500 miles and is being sold from a private collection with no reserve, so could go cheaply.

Finished in Teal Blue over a blue leather interior the GT also features chrome wire wheels, a Webasto sunroof, overdrive and a Gold Seal engine, which has been fitted with an unleaded head.

The vehicle's history file is substantial, featuring the BMIHT (British Motor Industry Heritage Trust) certificate, a stack of invoices (including a notable restoration invoice from 1992 totalling approximately £5,500), and old MOT certificates dating back to 1991.

Youngest MG entry is a maroon, rubber bumper 1978 MGB GT (Lot 32) with 97,000 miles indicated and an asking price of between £5,500 and £6,500.

The paperwork includes manuals, club magazines and invoices totalling over £10,000. Notably, a bill of sale from 2004 details a purchase from California Classics of Hull, amounting to £13,270.65, covering not just the car but also additional features like a cassette player, walnut dash, sunroof, mudflaps and custom number plates.

The auction starts at 10am with viewing from 8am to 3pm on the days leading up to the sale.
