He has written several books including Wildlife Wanderer released in March 2017 and Wildlife Wanderings in 2020. He has also contributed articles to The Countryman magazine, Blackmore Vale magazine and Dorset Magazine.

MG at the Goodwood Festival of Speed

MG will take centre stage at this year's Goodwood Festival of Speed from the 11-14 of July. The famous British marque will be in pole position on the front lawn of Goodwood House to celebrate the centenary of the iconic motoring brand.

MG's highly anticipated, Cyberster EV roadster (due here this summer) will headline Gerry Judah's annual sculptural masterpiece which will be kept under wraps until the sell-out event opens next month.

The Duke of Richmond, founder of the Festival of Speed, said: "Following the world debut of the striking Cyberster at the 2023 Festival of Speed, we are delighted that MG is returning to Goodwood this year to celebrate their centenary in style with their first Central Feature.

"It is set to be a fitting tribute to the first 100 years of one of Britain's oldest and most popular manufacturers, which has enjoyed a long association with Goodwood.

"MGs were almost ever-present at the circuit from 1948-1966, and before that, my grandfather ran the MG team in the 1930s, winning the famous Double-Twelve Hour Race at Brooklands in 1931.

"He was fascinated by their light weight, simplicity and clever engineering - characteristics which still underpin the brand today. MG's 100-year history combined with their continuous drive for innovation, aligns perfectly with this year's 'Horseless to Hybrid' theme, which recognises the advances in technology and power that have shaped motorsport over the last 130 years."

As well as being front-of-house, MG will also return to the famous hill climb in 2024 and the company will announce further debuts destined for the Festival of Speed nearer the time.

The Cyberster is now available to order with the first UK deliveries planned for August this year.



The single motor Cyberster Trophy is available from £54,995 and features signature scissor doors as well as a fully electric fabric hood which can be opened or closed in as little as 15 seconds at speeds up to 30mph.

The Trophy delivers power figures of 340PS (250kW) with maximum torque confirmed at 350 lb ft (475 Nm). The 0-62mph sprint is completed in just 5.0 seconds.

The £59,995 Cyberster GT will be the marque's new flagship, and the most powerful production model in MG's 100-year history with no less than 503PS (375kW) and 725Nm (535 lb ft) of torque. The dual-motor, all-wheel-drive GT is capable of sprinting from 0-62mph in 3.2 seconds.

MG4 gets top Used EV award

MG's all-electric MG4, has been named the 'Best Used EV' at the 2024 Automotive Management (AM) Awards.

The MG4 has achieved over 30,000 UK sales and the line-up includes the SE, SE Long Range, Trophy Long Range and Trophy Extended Range which can deliver up to 323 miles of driving range on one charge.

Classic cars at Lulworth Castle

A small contingent of club cars ventured west into the Purbecks last month to take part in the Lulworth Castle Annual Car Show organised by the Dorset Blind Association - among them was Eddie Milligan (pictured) who writes this report . . .

'The 250 exhibitors arrived between 9am and 10am when we collected our welcome pack, which had a number telling you where you were to park - we were also given coffee and bacon roll vouchers prior to moving in convoy to the display areas in front of Lulworth Castle.

The cars on display varied from old classic cars to modern powerful sports cars. There were several stands selling a variety of wares, plus several food outlets.

There were also several singers and entertainers including Bournemouth Carnival Band dressed as Spidermen and women. The weather was glorious and the crowds came out in their masses and we enjoyed visiting the castle and had a cream tea before leaving.

It is a shame more club members didn't attend - it's a great show and the weather was wonderful.'



SWVA Classic Auction results

A trio of cars from the collection of 1020 club member Patrick Havill who died last year, all found new owners at the most recent South Western Vehicle Auctions classic sale.

These included Patrick's Metallic Almond Green 1951 MG TD which he re-acquired in February 2019, having previously owned the car in the late 1950s and early 1960s and in which, in 1962, he won his first motorsport speed event.

It easily exceeded its modest guide price of $\pm 8,000$ to $\pm 9,000$ and went for a more realistic but still competitive $\pm 13,200$ before buyer's premium.

Also from Patrick's collection, his 1988 Caterham 7 Race Car also topped its reserve to make £12,100, while his 2004 Ferrari 360 Spider finished in Ferrari Rosso was one of the star lots of the day easily exceeding its £50,000 reserve and going up to £59,000.

MG Midgets were to be found in abundance at the sale headlined by a 1972 example in the ever-popular Blaze Red that started out with a punchy estimate of $\pm 6,500-\pm 7,500$ and despite failing to reach its guide price sold for $\pm 5,000$.

An early 1964 square wheel arch British Racing Green Midget made £3,500 while a late chrome bumper 1973 Midget in red went higher at £4,100 and a 1972 Midget in less fashionable bronze yellow was a surprise at £4,500.



By comparison a clean looking Damask Red 1974 Midget that was previously bought in September 2004 for £4,300 slipped to a knock-down £3,600.

A pair of MGB Roadsters also appeared in the catalogue with a clean looking 1971 MGB version in ever popular flame red with wire wheels finding a new owner for just £5,100, while a pullhandle 1965 Roadster in British Racing Green did slightly better at £6,750.

The cheapest MG on the day was a 2002 MGF in silver with nearly 60,000 miles on the clock which went for a hammer price of £1,000 while an imported 1939 MG TA Sports failed to reach its £20,000 reserve.

The next classic auction is on Thursday 25 July.

Several members arrived in their MGs and were rewarded with a sunny evening to appreciate the drive out into the forest.

Beaulieu close-up photo exhibition

Feats of personal endeavour, endurance and achievement are brought into high-definition focus in a new exhibition at the National Motor Museum that showcases the hyper-detailed photography of Rick Guest.

This can now be found in the In Focus Gallery on the lower level of the museum and replaces the previous exhibition which featured photographs of notable people in the story of MG.

Known for his precision photographs of objects in close-up, Rick's images allow the viewer to see aspects of an object not normally visible to the human eye - this includes the patina created by time which creates a powerful sense of history and a direct connection with those who once owned the objects.

Having previously worked on large-scale projects for famous brand names such as Hugo Boss, Ferrari and Nike, Rick was commissioned by the museum to create oversized photographs



of items from their extensive archive to create the new exhibition which is titled ' Closer To The Edge'.

Among the items given the close-up treatment are: the Helbros gold-plated watch presented to Major Henry Segrave after becoming the first man to reach over 200 miles an hour on Daytona Beach in 1927.



Also the motorcycle and grand prix racer Mike Hailwood's 1960s cork-lined motorcycle crash helmet, and the goggles worn by Percy Lambert, the first person to drive a car 100 miles in an hour.

Also in the spotlight are a piece of the tail fin from one of the record-breaking Blue Bird cars of Malcolm Campbell featuring the union flag and the glove worn by Peter Collins when he finished second for Ferrari in the 1956 Mille Miglia.

These are supplemented by objects from private collections that include seven-time world champion Lewis Hamilton's 2020 Formula One steering wheel, the fighter pilot style helmet worn by Andy Green when he set the current supersonic World Land Speed Record of 763.035mph in 1997, and the Alfa Romeo badge from the car in which Tazio Nuvolari won the 1935 German Grand Prix.

Closer To The Edge - Precision Photography by Rick Guest will be on display in the museum until mid-September and is included in the general admission price to Beaulieu.


