Book now for the 2025 Winter Road Run

Places can now be booked for the first 1020 seasonal road run of the coming new year - the Winter Road Run and Pub Lunch on Sunday 16 February 2025.

The route (which should take under two hours to complete) has been devised by new committee member Alistair Reid and starts, as usual, at Hamworthy Sports Club and will finish locally at the St Peter's Finger pub at Lytchett Minster for a pre-booked Sunday roast.

Entry for the run (which includes a route book and rally plaque) is £5 per car and all its occupants. For those who want to join us for lunch at the finish there is a £10 per head meal deposit which will be refunded in cash on the day.

The pub is offering a choice of roasts: beef (£19.25), chicken (£18.25) and pork (£18.25) with a vegetarian alternative. Desserts can be selected on the day. The full cost of the meal (mains, desserts and drinks) is payable direct to the pub.





Entry forms will be available at the December, January and February club nights from either Adrian Mullins or Pip Bonner - alternatively, a form can be obtained by emailing Pip at pip@1020mg.org.uk - a form also appears on the diary page entry for the event on the 1020 website.

Completed forms should be returned to Pip Bonner and payments made to Ursula Bonner (payment details are on the entry form).

The closing date for entries is Monday 03 February - any cancellations after this date will result in the loss of the meal deposit as we must confirm numbers and food choices with the pub the following day.

If the weather is inclement, MGs are not compulsory so keep your classic MG in the warm and dry and bring an ordinary road car - it should still be a fun day.

Strong arm tactics at club night

Club members learnt some useful self-defence tips last month when the Bournemouth Shorinji Kempo Club provided an entertaining and information packed martial arts demonstration.

The primary piece of advice was where possible to avoid entering a dangerous situation but if not then Ian Hart, Branch Master of the club demonstrated some simple manoeuvres using the momentum of an assailant to overpower them.

Ian explained that Shorinji Kempo (the most popular form of martial art in Japan) is designed to respond to an attack not to initiate one and combines elements of meditation and understanding how the human body works.

He and his students (many of them black belt masters) then ran though warm-up exercises and basic moves and techniques before explaining in slow motion how to defend yourself against an assailant.

Club members were invited to take part and learn some useful techniques including how to attempt to disarm an attacker with a knife.











Solent MGOC day at Stansted Park

Our south coast neighbours at Solent MGOC have announced that their annual event at Stansted Park, Rowlands Castle near Portsmouth will take place on Sunday 18 May 2025.

The day brings together MG owners from across the region and includes tours of the gardens and house and a garden centre.

Flying high on 1020 coach trip

A packed coach of club members and guests made the 90-minute journey last month to visit the Fleet Air Arm Museum at Yeovilton in Somerset.

The location is home to the National Museum of the Royal Navy housing aircraft (including numerous helicopters) dating back over 100 years to 1909, from turn of the century cloth and string biplanes to modern jet aircraft that have seen battle in the Falklands and Iraq.

Participants were able to tour the four exhibition halls at leisure studying over 90 aircraft, among them a Short Type 184 the only British aeroplane to take part in the Battle of Jutland in 1916, a 1916 Sopwith Pup (replica), a WW2 Supermarine Seafire, a Hawker Sea Fury, a Westland Dragonfly, a de Havilland Sea Vixen, McDonnell Douglas Phantom, a Hawker Siddeley Buccaneer and a BAe Sea Harrier.

Many took the opportunity to walk through and view the cockpit of the first British Concorde (002) which made a total of 439 test flights and flew supersonic for 173 hours - it is probably the most iconic exhibit in the museum even if not strictly Naval.

Even more time had to be taken to tour the award-winning Aircraft Carrier Experience which shows (with animated videos) the numerous operational centres of an aircraft carrier.



Tracing the history of a Dorset classic

If you are researching the early history of a Bournemouth or Dorset-registered classic car (be it an MG or any other marque) then one of the first places you should start the search is the Dorset History Centre at Bridport Road, Dorchester according to classic car journalist and multiple classic car owner **Kim Henson** who explains more ...

If your pre-1980s classic car was originally registered in Bournemouth or indeed Dorset, the History Centre still holds registers pertaining to the car's original first registration. This can be handy for dating purposes, or to find out a bit more about your car's history

Dorset History Centre holds records of both the Dorset and Bournemouth Borough Motor Taxation and Licensing Departments.

These collections include registers for vehicles. The registers vary in detail after 1920, but often provide the registration mark; surname of the owner; address (usually just the town); supplying garage or dealer; make of vehicle; and class of licence (i.e. private or goods).

Motor taxation departments also created index cards, which may include further information about a vehicle, such as the chassis number.

They hold most of the index cards for Dorset, but the cards for Bournemouth have not been deposited here, and it is unlikely that they have survived.

If they can trace the vehicle you are interested in, they can provide you with a certified paper copy of each entry for the cost of £17.00 each, including postage and handling.

Electronic copies of each register entry (i.e. one for each vehicle) cost £6 per vehicle. There's also a small additional 'handling' fee.

Owners are also welcome to visit Dorset History Centre to view the original documents in their search room. Opening hours are Wednesday to Friday, 9am - 5pm, and the first Saturday of each month.

Access to original documents is by pre-booked appointment only. You can use your own camera to photograph the documents, a permit costs £5 per session.

If you do choose to view original archive material, you will need an Archives Card. This a single archive reader's ticket which gives you access to original archive material held in archives across the UK. It is free of charge, and valid for five years.

History hunters are recommend to start their search by registering online before your visit at www.archivescard.com

To complete your registration, you will need to bring two official documents, one of which shows your current address and signature - a driving license, passport or utility bill are all ideal documents.

The lady that responded to my enquiry was Anna Wrayford, history centre assistant, Dorset History Centre (tel: 01305 250550), although I didn't actually speak to Anna as we corresponded by e-mail: archives@dorsetcouncil.gov.uk

I found that she was very helpful and the process easy and it took a few days to receive the copy documents, but well worth the wait. More information can be found on Dorset Archive's website: www.dorsetcouncil.gov.uk/dorsethistorycentre

As some of you may know, I have several cars that were registered with Bournemouth registrations, and I enquired about all of them - here are the fascinating results.

Alas they couldn't help me with my Morris Ital estate, registered in January 1983 - I think that by then the records were no longer kept.

However, I discovered that 'Pru' my Austin A30 (PRU 818) was first sold, on 01 February 1955, to a Mr Langley, via Males Garage. I had never heard of them - does anyone else know who or where they were, I wonder?

From the register copies I also found out that my A50 (SEL 971) was first sold from Parkstone Motor Company on 19 September 1955, and that son Anthony's A30 'Archie', (UEL 972) was old from the same garage, on 17 January 1957.

Meanwhile my A50 (TLJ 458) was sold from Huxhams on 18 May 1956, while my wife Elaine's A35 'Snowflake' (XRU 539) was sold from Imperial Motors based in Bournemouth on 19 December 1958.

I also discovered my A55 Cambridge Mark II (1393 EL), bought by my mum and dad as the family car in 1964, was originally sold from Imperial Motors on 18 July 1959.

This makes it one of the very first of the 'Farina' style A55 Cambridges, and it has many features unique to the earliest examples (such as a vestigial 'Flying A' on the bonnet, different doors and wipers).

I also checked on my first car, a 1959 Reliant Regal Mark V sidevalve (183 AEL) which I bought in 1969 and wish I still had it (sold in 1970 after buying 'Pru').

By coincidence it was sold just nine days before, on 9 July 1959. It was sold from Marsh and Fry.

Overall, I am very pleased that I sent off for this information, just nice to have a bit more history for each of my locally-registered cars.

Mixed fortunes for MGs in classic sale

Classic and modern MGs suffered differing fates at the most recent SWVA Classic Vehicle sale at Holton Heath.

Of the total of 81 lots in the auction 17 remained unsold, mainly the higher priced entries including two of the MGs in the Autumn sale.

The top price paid for an MG was the £10,200 for an all red 1952 TD (Lot 52) with 73,134 miles indicated (see below).

This USA import and right-hand drive conversion had been modestly estimated at £9,000, even so someone got a bargain.

From the usual collection of MGBs, a 1972 GT finished in Harvest Gold with a black leather interior (Lot 45) just reached its lower estimate of £4,500 as did (Lot 39), a 1978 red MGB that topped its pre-sale estimate by £500.

Finding a new home for £4,000 was a 1976 MGBGT in British Racing Green (Lot 36) which had been the subject of a major rebuild between 2001-2004.





There was disappointment that an attractive 1950 Y Type saloon (Lot 42) pictured above, finished in an eye-catching two-tone Turquoise and Cream only made £3,700.

The youngest MG in the catalogue, a Triple Black 2003 TF135 (Lot19) sold for £700 despite being shy of its book estimate showing that TF prices are slipping somewhat, certainly at this time of the year.

Among the entries that failed to sell were a pretty 1937 TA (Lot 74) in Primrose Yellow which was short of its £17,000 reserve, while short of its modest £13,000 reserve was a 62,000-mile 1968 MGCGT (Lot 55) in popular Old English White paintwork imperfections may have put off serious bidders.


