## Book now for the 2025 Winter Road Run

Places can still be secured for the first 1020 seasonal road run of the coming new year - the Winter Road Run and Pub Lunch on Sunday 16 February 2025.

The route (which should take under two hours to complete) has been devised by new committee member Alistair Reid and starts, as usual, at Hamworthy Sports Club and will finish locally at the St Peter's Finger pub at Lytchett Minster for a pre-booked Sunday roast.

Entry for the run (which includes a route book and rally plaque) is £5 per car and all its occupants. For those who want to join us for lunch at the finish there is a £10 per head meal deposit which will be refunded in cash on the day.

The pub is offering a choice of roasts: beef (£19.25), chicken (£18.25) and pork (£18.25) with a vegetarian alternative. Desserts can be selected on the day.

The full cost of the meal (mains, desserts and any drinks) is payable direct to the pub on the day.

A form also appears on the diary page entry for the event on the 1020 website (www.1020mg.org.uk).

Completed forms should be returned to Pip Bonner and payments made to Ursula Bonner (payment details are on the entry form).

The closing date for entries is Monday 03 February (that month's club night) - any cancellations after this date will result in the loss of the meal deposit as we must confirm numbers and food choices with the pub the following day.

If the weather is inclement, MGs are not compulsory so keep your classic MG in the warm and dry and bring an ordinary road car - it should still be a fun day.

## Annual membership subs now due

The annual 1020 membership subscription fee is now due for all 1020 club members - the committee has decided to hold the amount at £10 per household for the coming year - all subscriptions (no matter when you joined the club) are due in January.


The total was raised from the Festival Hamper Draw at the Christmas lunch, combined with the proceeds of the December club night raffle and personal cash donations.

## **Dartmoor Weekender 2025**

Following the success of last year's 1020 long weekend away to take part in the Cotswold Caper, organiser Adrian Mullins has created another outing for 2025 - this time to take part in the Tamar Valley MGOC People and Places Run.

As well as being part of the official run, Adrian has created a four-day event (05 to 08 September 2025) that includes three nights accommodation, an additional road run for 1020 members only and evening meals.

The weekend is based around the Tamar Valley region of Devon just outside Plymouth and is based for the three nights at the Moorland Hotel near the village of Wotter.

It is a three-star hotel with Trip Advisor giving it 4.5 out of 5 (685 reviews); it sits on the quiet southern slopes of Dartmoor National Park and is 20 minutes from the centre of Plymouth. It has views across the South Hams to the sea (see below).

The Moorland Hotel is ideal for touring this beautiful part of South Devon. There are many National Trust properties close by, and the Eden Project is a pleasant hour's drive away.



The hotel is also offering the option of a three-course evening meal for  $\pm 27$  per person (again a negotiated price). They can do vegetarian and Gluten free alternatives if needed.

Adrian has negotiated a special price of £95 per night for a double room Bed and Breakfast (rooms normally about £105 plus £10 for breakfast). Singles £75. The hotel has confirmed if people want longer stays this rate will apply.

The itinerary starts with travelling from Bournemouth to Wotter for the first overnight at the Moorland Hotel. On Saturday Adrian is planning a local road run that uses the Tamar Ferry into south east Cornwall to see Kingsand and Cawsand, the spectacular Whitsand Bay and from there back to the hotel via Looe or Bodmin Moor and Tavistock or via the Tamar Bridge.

Sunday starts with travelling to the start of the Tamar Valley MGOC People and Places Run which is open to all ages of MG and to non-MGs.



The start and finish point has yet to be announced but should be within a short distance of the hotel and is likely to cost participants £30 per car.

The route will be between 70 and 100 miles and 1020 members will then continue back to the hotel for dinner and overnight stay.

On the Monday participants are free to return to Bournemouth at their leisure or to stay longer in Devon.

Several club members have already put their names down for the weekend - anyone else who wishes to take part has only a few days to let Adrian know as the discounted hotel price is only open until 31 December and places on the Tamar Run are very limited and need to be booked early.

A non-refundable deposit of £50 is required by the hotel (below) to book a room for the three nights - you need to book direct to the hotel not 1020 - quoting "Mullins MG" party.

## **MG HS named Best Family SUV**

MG Motor UK rounded off a successful 12 months with the new MG HS Petrol being crowned Best Family SUV at the cinch Car of The Year Awards 2024.

Adding to the success, the new MG HS Plug-in Hybrid (PHEV) was named runner-up in the Best Hybrid category.

Sam Sheehan, motoring editor for cinch, noted: "Put simply, it represents arguably the best value for money of any car from any segment. At £25,000 from new, it offers proper SUV practicality, but for crossover money. It drives nicely too."

The MG HS range notched total sales of 28,595 units for the brand's flagship SUV in 2024, helping the model secure seventh place in the overall UK Total Industry Volume (TIV) rankings.

## **New Forest Run 25th Anniversary**

Our close neighbours at Southampton and New Forest MGOC have announced details for their New Forest Run which takes place on Sunday 01 June 2025 - this will be their 25th Anniversary Run so they are hoping to make it a memorable event.

The start and finish point is the same on this occasion and is at a new location, The Exbury Club, which is not to be confused with Exbury Gardens. This was once the Cricket Club of Exbury and is located beyond Exbury Gardens on the road to Lepe (and was passed by those on the 1020 Spring Run last year).



The run will cover approximately 70 miles of beautiful countryside, wildlife, peace and tranquillity. Entry fee is £27 per car which includes your route book, rally plate and finishers plaque. The entry is limited to 200 cars.

Cooked refreshments will be available at both the start and the finish; you will be required to pre-order all cooked food on the entry form and pre-pay along with your entry fee. Tea and cakes will also be served in the Pavilion during the afternoon with no pre-ordering required.

As in previous years the surplus from the day will be split between two local charities and further details will be available in the route book on the day.

# Can you identify this hard-top?

Club member Terry Trickett is hoping that a fellow MGB owner may be able to shed some light on the unusual hard top he acquired when he purchased his car in April 2022.

Pictures of the car with the hard-top attached are illustrated on this page.

Terry says that the hard top comes in four sections and he has only recently fitted it for the first time this winter (see attached). On a recent trip to Phoenix Classic Cars they said they had never seen this type of roof before - so does anyone out there have more information?

He explains that the two forward roof panels with the square glass panels clip together and are partly held in place by attaching to the windscreen using the same points as for the fabric folding roof.





The next panel is held in place using the same three bolt holes that hold the folding roof in place, then the rear glass panel bolts to this section.

Having carried out his own research on the internet and by asking the local MG specialists, Terry says that he has been unable to find any information about the roof but would like to know more about it.

If you think you can shed any light on this let Chris Adamson know and he will pass the details on and publish them in a future issue of this newsletter. We would all like to know more.




